In summary, the applicant presented the following:

- Building colours and materials
- Community-oriented design elements re: balconies, community green space, outdoor private amenity spaces, parking entrance, townhouse covered spaces
- Consistency with UEL Block F Design Guidelines
- Landscape design: enhancement of pedestrian entrances and paths; native plant species; rainwater collection features, like swales and pools; grade transition
- Site location and elevation studies re: area history/land connection, rammed earth concept
- Traditional design/incorporation of Musqueam art and public art concept

5.3 Questions from Panel to Applicant

In summary, the Panel and the Applicant discussed:

- Access for garbage and emergency services
- Building design: cladding materials, composition and safety re: asbestos; hallway configuration and vertical circulation in condos; Indigenous consultation; unit layouts (1 and 3-bedroom only) and roof deck potential for the townhouses
- Carsharing, bike sharing, and onsite parking
- Colour palette: lightness/darkness in consideration of building proximity, change in seasons, depth; comparison to adjacent buildings and landscape
- Community center contribution from local residents
- Energy design: BC Energy Step Code 3, renewable energy-based heating/cooling
- Garbage management in swales and waterways

- Landscape design: allergy potential of plantings; existing tree retention; rain and sun protection in outdoor amenity spaces; outdoor patio geometry and hard surface in conjunction with trees/plantings
- Site security: fencing, lighting, and illumination on pathways
- Water and storm water management: irrigation for plantings, bioswales and wetland

In summary, the Panel discussed:

- Building proximities, geometry
- Colour palette
 - o balance of light/dark, complement to adjacent properties, wood elements
- Construction access to site
- Musqueam/Indigenous design elements
- Privacy concerns between units re: sightlines
- Stormwater management plan, compliance with requirements re: absorbency, retention, water quality
- Water elements, scale, native plantings

Having considered the design as presented and the *Land Use, Building and Community Administration Bylaw*, the Advisory Design Panel recommends that the applicant, and UEL staff where indicated, consider the following for Development Permit Application #12/22 at Lots 9 & 10, Block F, District Lot 140, Plan EPP119156:

Recommendation 1:

Further development of the design elements that are influenced by Indigenous consultation, particularly the entrances, public trellises, and weaving elements, and opportunities for art.

Recommendation 2:

Changing the stark white panel to a darker and/or warmer, or wood, panel that may recede behind the trees and landscape. Interior materials and finishes could also be considered to add visual depth from the outside.

Recommendation 3:

Avoiding common allergens in the planting plan, such as birch trees.

Recommendation 4:

Paying more attention to the roofscape. If roof decks are not feasible, greater consideration needs to be made for the materiality, finish, and visual appearance.

That the above recommendation(s) be adopted. 8 in favour; none opposed.
