Quiet Days (Sunday and Stats)

Did you know that Sundays and statutory holidays are considered quiet days in the UEL? The UEL Noise Bylaw prohibits any noise which is likely to disturb the quiet, peace and enjoyment of individuals on these days. Please be considerate of your neighbours, and schedule noisy activities such as lawn mowing, construction, or use of noisy equipment outside of these days.

UEL Multi-family Parking

In accordance with the parking requirements of the *Land Use, Building and Community Administration* Bylaw, only residents residing in multi-family (Area D Neighbourhood) residences constructed prior to 1970 are eligible for a multi-family parking permit.

Multi-family parking permits must be renewed annually and expire on September 30th of each year. Call us at (604) 660-1808 to confirm permitting requirements.

Dog Licensing

All dogs three months of age and older must be licensed within the UEL. The licences and tags may be obtained from the UEL Administration Office and must be renewed annually. If you haven't renewed yet for 2023, it's time!

Organics Disposal Tips

Your organics (or green) waste tote can be used for more than your yard waste! Organics include:

- Food scraps: including meat, fish, poultry, bones, dairy products, bread, pasta, solidified fats and grease, fruit, vegetables, eggshells, coffee grounds, tea bags and plate scrapings
- Food-soiled paper products: including paper towel and tissues, parchment paper and paper takeout food packaging (make sure it's not coated in plastic!)
- Yard trimmings: including grass clippings, leaves, prunings, plants and branches

Hedge Trimming/Yard Maintenance

Property owners are responsible for maintaining their hedges at least 1 foot away from the sidewalk or lane to keep the area accessible and free of obstructions. Lawns, yards and boulevards must be maintained so that they are neat and tidy, with grass no longer than 4 inches.

Human-Wildlife Conflict
